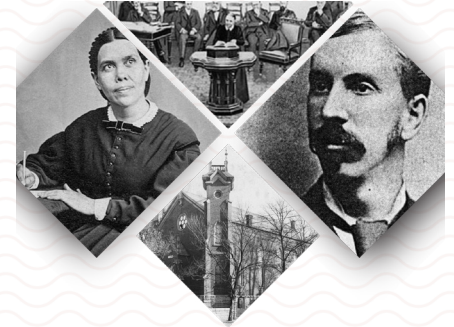

JAIME JORGE

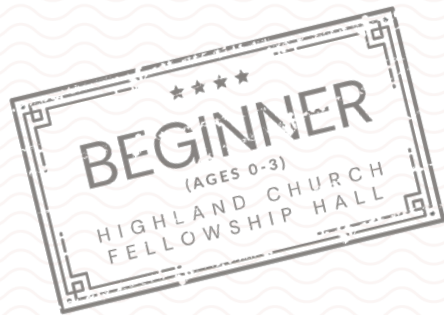

GENERAL INFORMATION

CAMP MEETING ATTIRE: Although the setting of Camp Meeting is more relaxed and informal, we encourage attire that is both appropriate to the occasion and representative of Christian principles of modesty and good taste.

ATTENTION PARENTS: Supervision of your children during Camp Meeting is essential. Children are expected to participate in the meetings and activities that are planned for them. When not participating in those activities, you are responsible for their whereabouts and conduct. Beginner through Primary divisions will have supervised drop off 15 minutes prior to meetings.

FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED: Listening devices are available from the ushers.

PRE-REGISTRATION: Pre-registration for lodging at Camp Meeting 2025 will be held in the Ad Building on Tuesday (for those that want their same spot) and Wednesday (open registration) from 10 am -12:00 pm.

FURNITURE: Please do not move furniture from one room or tent to another.

PETS: With the exception of licensed service animals, pets are not permitted on the campgrounds.

COOKING: Cooking is permitted in the tent and RV area only. Please refrain from using open flame cooking devices and use portable electric stoves instead.

AUDITORIUM SEATING: Lawn chairs will be permitted on the side and rear sections only. Lawn chairs in the main auditorium not occupied at the time services begin will be considered open seating and will be available to anyone. Seat cushions may be used anywhere in the auditorium, but must be removed at the close of each meeting.

FIRST AID: CALL 911 For Emergencies. The First Aid Station is primarily for the assessment of injuries. Families should be prepared to handle your own minor issues (cuts, scrapes, bumps, splinter, etc.); and should come prepared with their own equipment and prescriptions, pain relievers, band-aids, etc.

CAMP MEETING OFFERINGS: All offering collections are for Evangelism within the KYTN Conference, with the exception of the Sabbath School offering, which will be allocated to Sabbath School Missions. Offerings are collected each evening with the exception of Tuesday and Thursday nights.

PRAYER TENT: The Prayer Tent, which is located inside the Raphan Ley Auditorium, will be open during all free times. Prayer warriors will be available following the evening meetings until 10 P.M.

QUIET TIME: Begins each evening at 10:30 p.m.

SEVERE WEATHER

For protection from harm, pay close attention to changing weather conditions. If you know thunderstorms are expected. Stay tuned to local stations or a NOAA weather radio station. Some tornadoes strike rapidly without time for a warning. Plan, prepare and practice what to do if a tornado threat occurs. Falling and flying debris cause most injuries and deaths during a tornado. Although there is no completely safe place, some locations are much safer than others.

- Dorm residents go to the basement or lowest floor. (Ad-building also has a shelter area in the basement.)
- Tent and RV campers go to the gymnasium. (Bathrooms and Kitchenette areas preferred.)
- Go to a room without windows (bathroom, closet, center hallway with doors closed).
- For added protection get under something sturdy (a heavy table or workbench).
- Cover your body with a blanket, sleeping bag or mattress. Protect your head, etc.

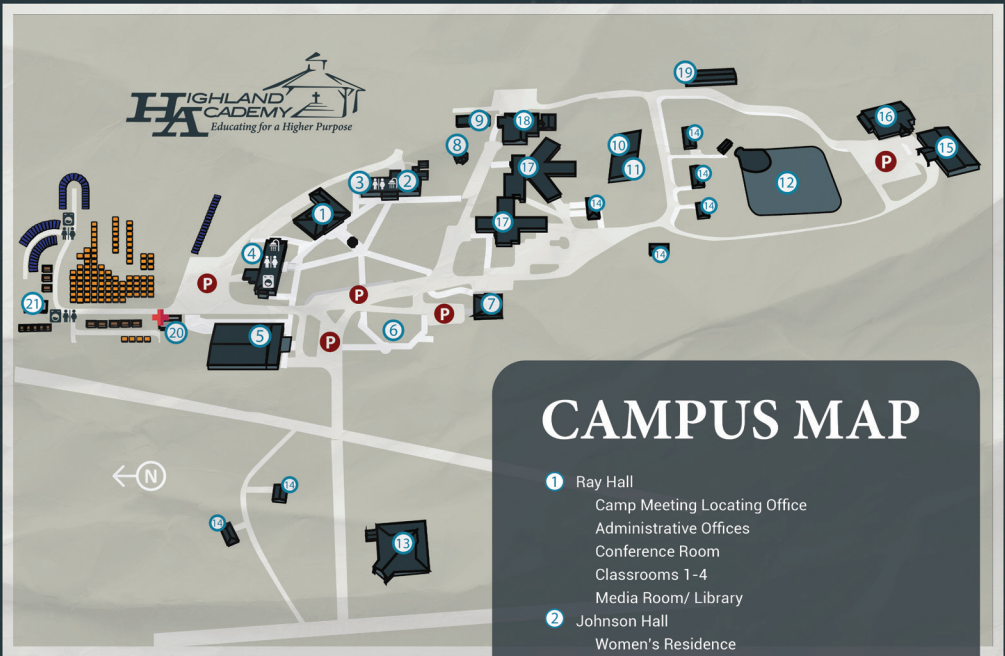


